1. COURSE OUTLINE

This course involves the study of the legal environment in which a business entity operates. The entire framework of the judicial system is discussed with emphasis on the systems, institutions, and processes related to the business environment. Specific case analysis related to pertinent legal issues shall illustrate how they affect the nature in which businesses operate. Special emphasis on international and national legal structures will provide a fundamental understanding of the basis of jurisprudence related to corporate regulation. Key concepts will demonstrate the need to pursue additional professional legal expertise when the need arises.

2. AIMS

The aim of this course is to develop knowledge in understanding the primary sources of law, related legal frameworks, procedural systems in conjunction with business-related issues. In addition, the course aims to enhance problem-solving skills in addressing case study scenarios.
