1. COURSE OUTLINE

The course will cover all aspects of veterinary surgery which include the use of surgical instruments and preparation of the animal for surgical, during the surgery and at recovery stage.

2. AIMS

This course aim to familiarize students with the surgery of various animal species especially cattle, sheep, goats, camel horses, dogs & cats. The lecture topics include tissue handling instrumentation, suturing and surgical principles and approaches to various organ systems and anatomical regions. preoperative planning, anesthesia and surgical techniques, operative room decision making and post-operative care. Students begin by practicing technical skills on inanimate models. They progress to performing a series of supervised operations designed to parallel the most performed surgeries in private practice.
